Code of Conduct

At this year's Parent Information Evening I outlined the School's Code of Conduct - in effect 1 January, 2017. The purpose of the Code of Conduct is to describe minimum standards of conduct in all behaviour and decision making to ensure the safety and well-being of students. The Code applies to staff, students, volunteers, parents and guardians. All breaches of the code are to be reported to the school Principal.

The code is expressed in the following twelve statements:

Conduct Statements

- 1. You act safely and competently.
- 2. You give priority to students' safety and well-being in all your behaviour and decision making.
- 3. You act in accordance with the values of the Gospel as defined in the Code of Ethical Conduct.

- 4. You conduct yourself in accordance with laws, agreements, policies and standards relevant to your relationship with the school community.
- 5. You respect the dignity, culture, values and beliefs of each member of the school community.
- 6. You treat personal information about members of the school community as private and confidential.
- 7. You give impartial, honest and accurate information about the education, safety and well-being of students.
- 8. You support all members of the school community in making informed decisions about students.
- 9. You promote and preserve the trust and privilege inherent in your relationship with all members of the school community.
- 10. You maintain and build on the community's trust and confidence in Catholic schools and the Church.
- 11. You act reflectively and ethically.
- 12. You allow students to have a voice in their education, safety and well-being.

SCHOOL FEES 2017

An Annual Account has gone home. There are many ways in which you can pay this; sign up to our regular direct debit payment system, three instalments over the year (as indicated on your statement) or pay the

annual amount by Friday, 3 March to receive a discount of 5% off the tuition component of your fees. EFTPOS, credit card, cash, cheque and BPAY are all available.

If you have an eligible HCC and wish to claim the discount you must complete the form available at the front office by Friday, 24 February, 2017. Families who had the HCC discount last year must also complete a new form.




